

Major Map: Latin American/Caribbean Studies

Effective Fall 2005

The interdisciplinary Latin American and Caribbean Studies major introduces students to the people, cultures and resources of Latin America and the Caribbean. The major includes studies in anthropology, economics, environmental studies, politics, and Spanish, along with three (3) core courses in Latin American and Caribbean Studies. One of the three (3) course courses is a senior capstone seminar. Proficiency in Spanish language is essential to the successful completion of the major. The Latin American and Caribbean Studies Steering Committee strongly recommends that all majors participate in Rollins' overseas programs in the region. Majors wishing to pursue courses at other institutions may petition the Steering Committee for course acceptance. Coursework in this major prepares students for positions in business, government, library research, international affairs, and other professions.

Only two (2) courses taken to fulfill requirements in another major or minor from the departments listed above and with a concentration on Latin America or the Caribbean may count toward meeting the requirements of the major in Latin American and Caribbean Studies. These must be approved by the Latin American and Caribbean Studies Coordinator.

Twelve (12) courses are required: at least eight (8) of these must be completed at Rollins and seven (7) must be at the 300-400 level.
