

Minor Map: Latin American/ Caribbean Studies

Effective Fall 2005

The minor in Latin American and Caribbean Studies is designed to complement a number of existing majors at the College by adding an international dimension. The minor is comprised of seven (7) courses spread among Latin American and Caribbean studies, political science, anthropology, environmental studies, and Spanish. Only two (2) courses taken to fulfill requirements in another major or minor from the departments listed below and with a concentration on Latin America or the Caribbean may count toward meeting the requirements of the minor in Latin American and Caribbean Studies. These must be approved by the Latin American and Caribbean Studies Coordinator.

Seven (7) courses are required.
